2. Overview of Community Council:

The purpose of the community council is to involve parents in decision making at the school level. Elected parents represent the parents of the school and participate in developing plans for improving the school, make decisions on how to best expend School LAND Trust Program monies, and increase public awareness of school trust lands and related policies.

- 3. School Improvement Plan and Trust Land Funds:
  - Seventy percent of students in K-3 will show "typical" growth or higher progress on DIBELS Pathways to Progress on end of DIBELS. Students 4-6 will use the mCLASS program in the year 2017-18 and create a baseline of data for creating future goals. Funding: \$1,860 for Mclass for 4-6 & \$8,00 for two reading tutors.
  - Reduce the percentage of students who are chronically absent (ten percent or more days with unexcused absences) from ten percent to nine percent. Funding: \$3,000 for incentives
  - Increase teacher capacity for differentiating student instruction, specifically in the area of enrichment during Tier 1 instruction. C1: When checks reveal students are already proficient, the occurrence of non-enrichment activity will decrease from 61% to 45%. P3: The absence of differentiated learning to meet individual needs will decrease from 42% to 20%. Funding: \$1,600 for substitutes & \$700 for text books

- Update the one-to-one devices for students in grades K-2 to increase differentiation and enrichment in the classroom. Funding: \$19,500 for technology updates- iPads & laptops.

#### **DIBELS:**

• A state report showing % of students who made "typical" progress in K-3 shows us at 71%, and the district being 67%. We are first out of Title schools, w/South Clearfield being second at 67%.

### **Language Arts:**

- Proficiency: 3-6@ 53%, we are first out of Title schools with Wasatch being second @51%. District average is 54%.
- In growth we are 9/16 Title schools @ 51, top school was Whitesides at 61. District average is 52

#### Math:

• Proficiency: 3-6@ 54%, we were tied for first with Layton @ 54%. District average is 55%.

#### Science:

- Proficiency: 4-6@ 57%, we are second in Title with Wasatch in first@58%. District average is 57%
- In growth we are second in Title @ 59, with first being Crestview@ 60. District average is 53.
